About the Training:

STRIVE is a collaborative, one-day virtual training event that explores how community-based efforts to prevent terrorism and counter violent extremism (CVE) fit into our nation's law enforcement homeland security mission.

Delivered in a live, virtual learning environment, the course brings together public-safety practitioners to learn and engage in meaningful discussions about the principles and practices that form the foundation of countering violent extremism in our nation's communities.

Learning Objectives:

Using guidance from the Department of Homeland Security on preparedness, along with the application of proactive community policing strategies, STRIVE participants will:

- ▶ **Develop** an accurate, current, and well-informed perspective on terrorism and violent extremism in our communities;
- ▶ **Examine** why terrorism and violent extremism occur, and detect the key environmental and social elements that enable and sustain it within a community;
- ▶ **Explore** the merits of implementing a Community of Practice model as a tool for preventing terrorism and countering violent extremism at the community level;
- ▶ **Consider** information-driven, community-based strategies that deny terrorism and violent extremism of its intended objectives; and
- ▶ **Recognize** the significance of resilience as a mechanism for dealing with fear, uncertainty, and disorder that terrorism and violent extremism can inspire.

Audience & Format

This course is intended for public-safety practitioners involved in, or seeking to be part of, community-based CVE efforts. Participants are expected to complete independent, web-based learning activities and to actively engage in group discussions using a microphone and web camera throughout the event. Each participant should plan to attend individually on a computer with a reliable internet connection and Google Chrome installed.

Participation as a group in a room equipped with one computer/AV set up is not supported by the design of the course and therefore is not permitted.
